Visit to the **Capitoline Museums**. The creation of the Capitoline Museums has been traced back to 1471, when Pope Sixtus IV donated a group of bronze statues of great symbolic value to the people of Rome. The collections are closely linked to the city of Roma, and most of the exhibits come from the city itself.

It is considered the most ancient collection in the world. In fact, the sculptural works, kept here, have an inestimable artistic value.

The Capitoline Museums are divided into "Palazzo dei Conservatori" and "Palazzo Nuovo" both in Capitol Square.
